

# National Unity Government of Myanmar

**National Unity Government** (Burmese: အမျိုးသားညီညွတ်ရေးအစိုးရ; abbreviated **NUG**) is a body claiming to be the legitimate government of Myanmar (Burma), existing in parallel with State Administration Council military junta. The NUG was formed in response to the Coup d'état that occurred on February 1, 2021. The structure of the NUG was formally announced by the Committee Representing Pyidaungsu Hluttaw (CRPH) on 16 April 2021. The cabinet includes lawmakers elected in the 2020 election, members of the ethnic groups and key figures in the anti-coup protest, almost all of whom are in hiding or in exile.<sup>[1][2][3][4][5][6][7]</sup> The military junta has declared the NUG to be illegal.<sup>[8]</sup>

The NUG has sought international recognition as the government of Myanmar,<sup>[9]</sup> and when the NUG was announced its designated minister for home affairs and immigration, Lwin Ko Latt, stated that he expects recognition by several countries soon.<sup>[10]</sup> The International Trade Union Confederation has called for recognition of the NUG by governments and the United Nations,<sup>[11]</sup> and the ASEAN Parliamentarians for Human Rights, a group of pro-human rights lawmakers within the ASEAN countries, have called on ASEAN to invite the NUG to the April 24 ASEAN summit rather than representatives of the military junta.<sup>[12]</sup>
